

AMERICAN EUROCOPTER MEDICAL AIRCREW AWARD

The American Eurocopter Medical Aircrew Award has been developed to recognize the dedication of the “medical side” of the aircrew. The award itself is based on missions flown or dispatched. Crew members receive an award pin and certificate for each level reached.

American Eurocopter offers similar award programs for pilots and maintenance technicians.

Award Criteria

- Award levels are based on number of missions flown (or dispatched) in a Eurocopter helicopter.
- Flights can be either public relations or medical in nature.
- Crew members may combine totals if flying for (or having flown for) more than one program.
- This award is applicable to any member of the medical aircrew:

Flight Nurses
Paramedics
Communications Technicians
Respiratory Therapists
Doctors

Qualification

To receive this award, a letter or e-mail should be submitted by the crew member’s current Program Director, acknowledging qualification for a given award/mission level. This may be done anytime throughout the year. Letters should include the following information:

- Program Name(s)**
- Award Level Earned**
- How the Award Level was Attained**
