

AMERICAN EUROCOPTER U.S. COAST GUARD FLIGHT HOUR AWARD

The American Eurocopter HH-65 Flight Hour Award has been developed to recognize all crew members' flight experience in the HH-65. The award is based on hours flown in the HH-65 and qualifying crew members receive an award pin, a patch and certificate for each level reached.

Eligible crew members include pilot, co-pilot, flight mechanic and rescue swimmer.

Award Criteria

- Award levels are based on number of hours flown in a Eurocopter HH-65 helicopter.
- Time in both current production and earlier Eurocopter models are valid.
- Pilots may combine times, if they have experience in flying more than one Eurocopter model.
- Hours should be cumulative, starting with the crew member's first flight experience in a Eurocopter HH-65 helicopter.
